

Clear Christmas Shaker Card by Leah Cornelius



Materials Used: Chameleon Color Tones Deluxe set; Hot Cocoa (BR2), Crimson Red (RD4), Grass Green (GR3), Deep Black (BK4), Aqua Marine (BG4), Olive Green (OL3), My Favorite Things Merry Christmoose stamp set, Memento Tuxedo Black ink, Recollections white cardstock, clear plastic page protector, sequins, foam tape, sewing machine.

Instructions:

- i. Cut the clear page protector down to 4 x 5 ½ inches. Sew up any sides that aren't already sealed.

Stamp the images onto white cardstock and the sentiment onto a white cardstock strip. Set the page protector and sentiment aside.



2. Begin coloring the moose using Hot Cocoa (BR2) and the brush nib infusing for 10 seconds. Color the sweater using Crimson Red (RD4) and

the brush nib infusing for 10 seconds. Color the hat and pants using Grass Green (GR3) and the brush nib infusing for 5 seconds. Finish by coloring the shoes and mug using Deep Black (BK4) and the brush nib infusing for 5 seconds. Trim the moose out.



3. Color the pillows beginning with the heart one using Aqua Marine (BG4) and the brush nib infusing for 15 seconds. Color the heart using Crimson Red (RD4) and the brush nib infusing for 3 seconds. Color the middle pillow using Olive Green (OL3) and the brush nib infusing for 20 seconds. Color the band using Hot Cocoa (BR2) and the brush nib infusing for 5 seconds.

Color the buttons with pure color and the brush nib using Crimson Red (RD4). The last pillow can remain uncolored as it will be covered up. Trim the image out.



4. Assemble the moose and pillows together with bit of adhesive. Pick out some coordinating sequins to fill the shaker card with. For an extra fun twist insert a gift card or some money in the clear pouch along with the sequins. Using foam tape adhere the moose and pillows to the front of the card. Sew up the top seam using a sewing machine.
