

Mug Art

Materials needed:- Chameleon re-inkers, (we have used Turquoise, Aquamarine, Indigo, Fuchsia, Warm Sunset and Lavender), Blender re-inker, Chameloen Pens Warm Grey 7 & Spring Meadow. Modge Podge Dishwasher Safe Gloss, Ceramic Mug, masking tape, paint brushes and palette.

How to:-

- 1) Apply masking tape to mug for areas you do not wish to have inked, then add a wash of blending solution to the area to be inked. Then dip paintbrush into chosen alcohol ink colours and allow to drip down the mug until the desired effect is achieved.



- 2) Allow to dry and then seal with Mod Podge Dishwasher Safe Gloss, apply 2-3 coats and leave for 28 days before being tempted to use the mug to ensure the gloss has fully cured.



1) Apply masking tape where you wish the ink to stop then add a drop of ink to the felt, repeat for all three colours making sure there is space between each colour, then add drops of blending solution between each space. Pounce the blending tool onto the mug rotating to get colour variation, be careful not to go over the same area too much or your design will be muddled. When dry apply 2-3 coats of Modge Podge Gloss and leave to cure for 28 days before using.



1) Using the brush nib of the Warm Grey 8 pen draw the bunny using small strokes to create texture, then change to the brush nib of the Spring Meadow pen and add blades of grass. Add any personalisation and sentiment to the design before sealing with 2-3 coats of Modge Podge Gloss.
