



Materials required:

Chameleon Color Tone pens Peony Pink, Light Peach and Evergreen, White and Olive Green Foamiran* , stamen (matt off white)*, Rosy Owl Dies * , Rose Leaves, Water Leaves, Flowers AC2, Heart Flowers, Flowers AC3, Flowers AC1. Floral wire, green tape and Beacon Foam adhesive. Tea Light Holder from Lidl.

Tools :- Piercing tool, ball tool, Go Cut & Emboss machine & Go Press & Foil Machine, foam mat.

How to:-

We will show you how to create one flower but use the same techniques for all the different flower and leaf types, make up several to decorate your desired object.



- 1) Die cut flowers from white Foamiran, I have cut 2 of each size to make one flower, but you can make fewer or more layers based on personal preference and leaves from Olive Green. Tip:- you can die cut several layers at once as the foam is thin.



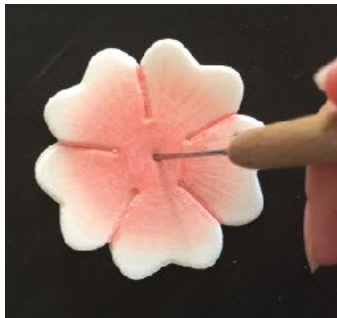
- 2) Without fusing the pen color the edges of the petals where they separate then color the petals. For the largest petal fuse the Light peach pen for 13 seconds and then color from the tip of the petal towards the centre, repeat this process until all the petals are colored on both sides. Then without fusing flick out from the centre of the petal towards the edge. Reduce fuse times for smaller petals.



- 3) Take between 3 and 5 double ended stamen and color the stems using the Light Peach pen without fusing, then fold in half wrap wire around and cover wire with green floral tape.



- 4) Pierce a hole into the centre of each flower and then place on the metal plate in the Go Press and Foil Machine, leave for at least 30 seconds then remove the flowers one at a time and shape by folding and twisting between your fingers.



- 5) Take the smallest petals and shape the centre with the ball tool, stretching the sides to open out the petals whilst leaving the tops wrinkled. Then thread stamen through the centre and glue individual petals together to form shape around stamen. Gradually build up each layer of petals glueing each one as you go along working from the smallest out to the largest petals until your flower is complete.



- 6) For the leaves fuse the Evergreen pen for 10 seconds and color from near the edge of the leaf out to the edge, then fuse again and flick to give a feathered effect. Colour stems without fusing and then heat and curl to shape then add wire behind to help hold shape.



- 7) Take all the flowers and leaves and arrange in the tea light holder using the wires to secure into place.
