



Materials required:- Chameleon Color Tone Pens, Light Peach, Mellow Yellow, Tangerine, Peony Pink, Crimson Red, Chameleon Color Tops Burgundy, Tangerine, Seville Orange, Fuchsia, Chameleon Color Tone Pencils Water Melon & Red Pepper. Elizabeth Craft dies, Pair of Leaves 1, Garden Notes Ivy Vine, Tuberosus Begonia, Garden Notes Rose 3, Garden Notes Peony 2, Garden Notes Dahlia, Garden Notes Gerbera Daisy, Elizabeth Crafts flower tools, Oasis posy handle, floral wire, floral tape, Dress My Craft flower tools, glue. White card and Various shades of green card.

Tools:- Die cutting machine we use Couture Creations Go Cut and Emboss Machine, Heat Gun, Wire Cutters and Loop Pliers.

- 1) Die cut leaves and Ivy from green card, shape and attach to wire (see video for further guidance). Then arrange around oasis to create a tear drop shape.

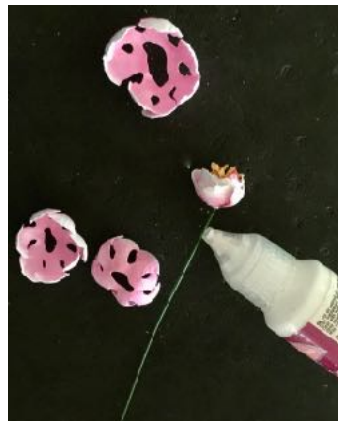




- 2) Die cut various flower shapes from white card. Colour the rose petals on both sides with the Crimson Red pen without fusing and then fuse for 5 seconds with the Burgundy Colour Top and flick from the base of each petal out towards the tip. Then shape using the Elizabeth craft tools and adhere together adding a piece of wire down the centre to create the rose.



- 3) For the Peony Fuse the pen for 10 seconds and then color from the tip of each petal in towards the middle on both sides, add Tangerine and Mellow Yellow to the central petals and stamen, shape (tip: if you dip the petals in water before shaping it helps to break down the fibres making them easier to shape then once shaped, set with a heat gun) and glue to wire.



- 4) Continue to color various flowers and attaching to stems until you have a selection that you can then arrange into the bouquet. Continue to fill the gaps until the oasis is completely covered.
