

Christmas Layout by Tracy McLennon



Materials Used:

Chameleon Pens; Spring Meadow (YG3), Crimson Red (RD4), Burgundy (RD5); Chameleon Pencil; Pine (1702), Heartfelt Creations Festive Holly Collection; Patterned Paper, Cling Stamps, Dies; Heartfelt Creations Sparkling Poinsettia Cling Stamps & Dies; Heartfelt Creations Deluxe Flower Shaping Kit; Natural Burlap String; Pearls; Beads; Tag; Stickles- Iced Coffee; 3D Crystal Lacquer; Stampin' Up Ink (Early Espresso); Scrapbook Adhesives by 3L; 3D Foam Squares, E-Z Runner Grand, Dual Tip Glue Pen

How to:-

- 1) Layout Background: 12x12 Festive Holly Patterned Background

White Cardstock 7.75x7.75

Red Patterned Paper 7.5x7.5

Cream Patterned Paper 1.5x7.5

Green Patterned Paper 2x7 (bottom edge torn)

- 2) Stamp all of the holly and poinsettia images onto white cardstock using dark brown ink. Die cut 1 lattice piece from white cardstock and cut it in half.
- 3) First add color to the holly berries using Crimson Red with no fuse. Then using the Pine colored pencil, add the shading to all of the holly leaves.



- 4) Then using Spring Meadow add color to all the holly leaves using a 3 second fuse from the inside of the leaf, out. Add color to the poinsettia petals using Burgundy with a 6 second fuse



from the inside, out. Die cut out all of the images.

- 5) Add 3D Crystal Lacquer to all of the holly berries. Let dry. Shape all of the holly leaves. Shape the poinsettia petals. Add beads to the middle of the flower using 3D Crystal Lacquer. Let dry. Add Stickles to the tips of each petal. Let dry.
- 6) Mat the photo in white cardstock and dark green patterned paper. Adhere to the layout using 3D



- foam squares. Add the white tag with a burlap bow above the matted photo. Add the lattice die cut pieces to the top and bottom of the cream patterned paper. Then add pearls to the lattice.
- 7) Add the poinsettia to the right of the matted photo. Then add holly pieces above and below the poinsettia. Add holly up by the tag above the matted photo.
