

Double Sided Bookmarks by

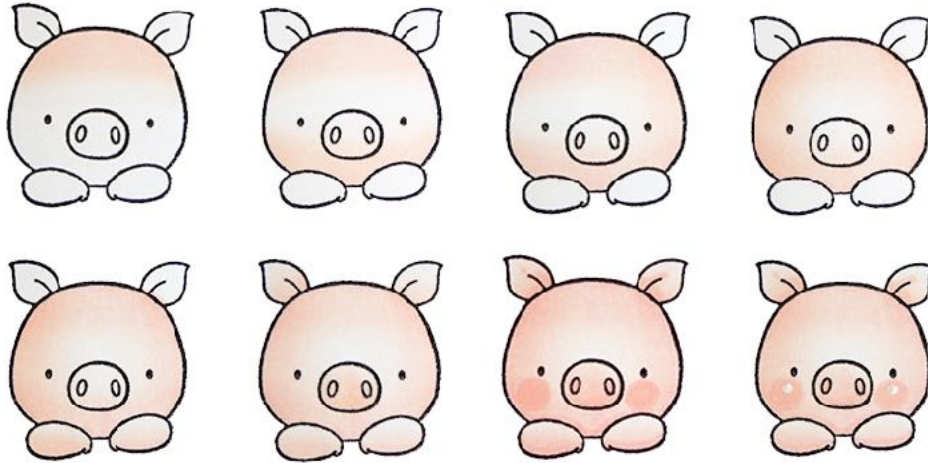


Materials Used: Chameleon Pens: Bisque (NU1); BB Hog Heaven and die-namics (MFT); Versafine Onyx Black ink pad; Clear embossing powder; Neenah Solar White card, Black card stock, Let's Polka 6" x 6" petite paper pack (Lawn Fawn); Corner Rounder Punch; White gel pen.

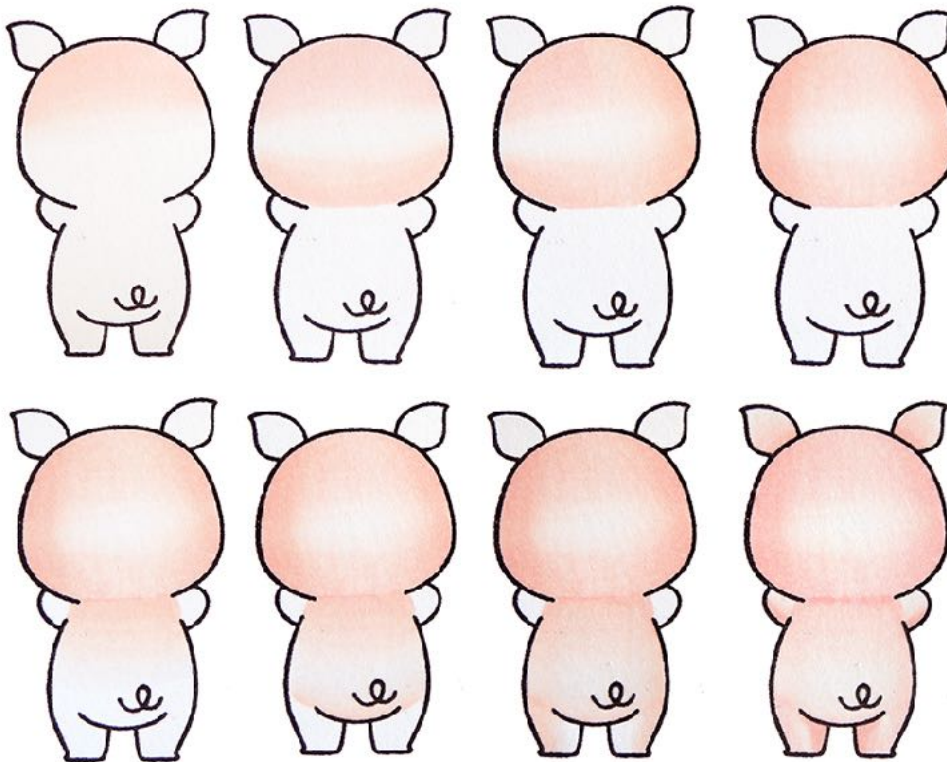
Instructions:

1. Stamp the pig face onto a piece of Neenah card by using the Versafine black ink, then emboss it with the clear powder. With Bisque pen, start coloring the face from the eye line, infusing the brush nib for 7-8 seconds. Repeat on the other side, then on the left and on the right side. Color the arms by infusing the brush nib for 3-4 seconds each, and the ears by infusing for 2-3 seconds each. Fill the nose infusing for 3-4 seconds. Color the cheeks without infusing, then add a light spot with the white gel pen to the cheeks.

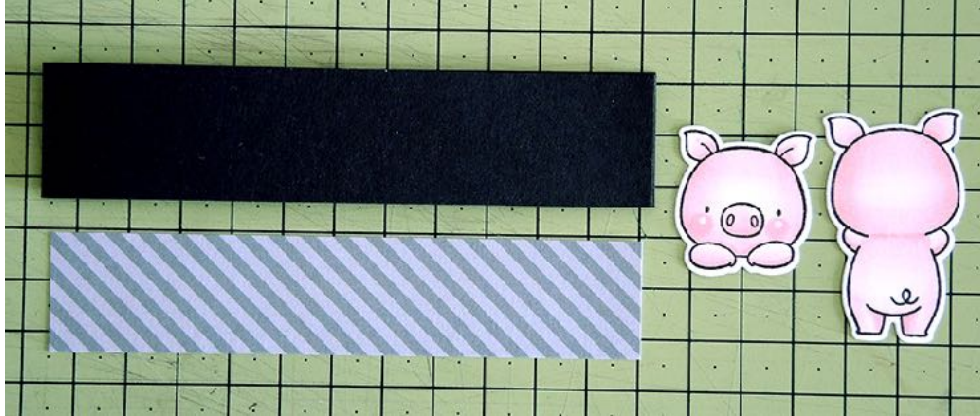


- Stamp and emboss the pig's back in the same way. Start coloring the head like the face at step 1. Color the body from the half back to the neck, then repeat from the half back to the bottom, infusing the brush nib for 7-8 seconds each. Repeat for the sides, including the legs. Color arms and ears infusing 3-4 seconds each. Add shadows without infusing.

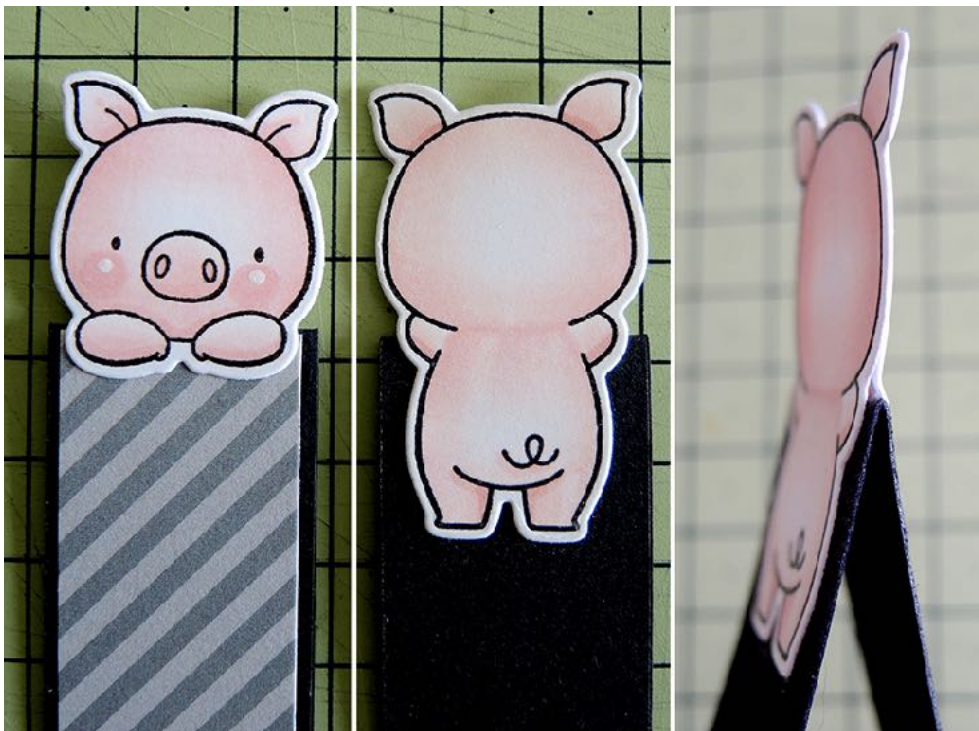

3. Cut a 9½" x 1" (24 cm x 2,5 cm) stripe of black cardstock and bend it in half. Cut a 4½" x 7/8" (11,5 cm x 2,2 cm) printed stripe from the paper pad. Cut out the pig parts with the dies.



4. Round the lower corners of the black stripe, then repeat for the colored one, and glue it onto the black stripe. Glue the body of the pig onto the back of the bookmark, then glue the face onto the head, keeping the black stripe in between. You can create lots of double sided bookmarks changing the length of the black stripe and the color of printed stripe on the front size.
